CHAMPAGNE

While Louis XIV disliked champagne, Louis XV shared it with his mistresses, and Louis XVI preferred still wine. Napoleon drank it only for celebrations, favouring Burgundy, while Louis XVIII liked sweet wines and Charles X preferred eaux de vie. Louis-Philippe I supported champagne's growth without drinking it, and Napoleon III had limited interest but it was during his reign that the first champagne ads appeared and artists began shaping the image of champagne.

This marked the start of rare, artist-designed bottles. The old-style silhouette, based on a vintage bottle found in a vault, is now used for the most prestigious cuvées, including Dom Pérignon, La Grande Dame, Dom Ruinart, and Comtes de Champagne. Each house developed its own signature cuvée, often in collaboration with artists to dress the bottle.

The majority of the grapes used for vinification come from a radius of 20km around Epernay, where the Grand Crus of Pinot Noir, Meunier and Chardonnay co-exist, in the ethereal vineyards of the Montagne de Reims, the Vallée de la Marne and the Côte des Blancs.

LAURENT PERRIER

A former cooper and bottler in Chigny-les-Roses, André-Michel Pierlot settled in Tours sur Marne in 1812 as a champagne wine merchant. It was in this Grand Cru village. Mathilde-Emilie Perrier, took over the reins of the company, adding her surname to that of Eugène Laurent to give the House the name.

Founded in 1743 by Claude Moët in Épernay, near Reims, Moët & Chandon swiftly earned renown among Europe's elite. Significant growth began in 1792 when Jean-Rémy Moët, the founder's grandson, expanded the house into an international wine trading powerhouse

LOUIS ROEDERER

The Tsar's wine - Louis Roederer's most famous wine was created in 1876 to satisfy the demanding tastes of Tsar Alexander II. The emperor asked Louis Roederer to reserve the House's best cuvée for him every year. He was particularly fond of the House's wine. To distinguish this cuvée, this exceptional champagne came in a flat-bottomed, transparent lead-crystal bottle. The new brand was named after this precious material, which is particularly transparent and luminous.

PERRIER JOUËT

Pierre-Nicolas Perrier and Rose-Adélaïde Jouët shared a love of nature and the arts. She was a cultured young woman from a Norman merchant family; he a masterful vintner and botanist. A year after their wedding, in 1811 they founded Maison Perrier-Jouët: born of their desire to create a Champagne House with a difference.

The 1984 wine regulations setting down the requirements for Vendange Tardive and Sélection de Grains Nobles wines is usually referred to as “Hugel’s Law”.

CHATEAU HAUT-VIGNEAU

Situated in the commune of Martillac, this 20-hectares property once belonged to Baron de Montesquieu. Today, the estate is owned by Mr. Eric Perrin which also owns the famous Château Carbonnieux. Because of its special localization, its terroir and the choices of winemaking in the vineyard and the cellar, the Château Haut-Vigneau plays between the greatest ones.

Château d'Yquem is the 100-hectare crown jewel of the Sauternes appellation. In the famous 1855 Bordeaux classification it was ranked the only Premier Cru Supérieur, higher even than the famous reds. The role of the 100 local harvest workers is paramount: they smell, and open the bunches in two to check the condition of the grapes. If just one berry is bad, the whole bunch is dropped to the ground. “There is no optical sorting table at Yquem,”.

PASCAL COTAT

Located in the western portion of the Sancerre appellation, Chavignol has a unique type of soil called, in French, “terres blanches.” The region is essentially a chalk plateau (the same vein as is found in Chablis) with clay and limestone soils. The top vineyards, ‘Monts Damnés,’ ‘Grande Côte,’ and ‘Les Culs de Beaujeu,’ are perched on steep hillsides with little topsoil.

Cotat as a rule harvests by hand and very late, as pushing ripeness to the extreme is one element that gives these wines their weighty texture and complexity. While the Pascal Cotat estate is not organically certified, they farm more or less according to organic principles, i.e. they do not treat their vines with pesticides; only indigenous yeasts are used for fermentation; and they follow the lunar cycle for racking.

The wines of François and Julien Pinon are considered among the finest of Vouvray. François, a former child psychologist, took over the estate from his father in 1987, and has steadily made a name for the estate. He is a serious winemaker whose main focus is “to keep the typicity of both the appellation and the vintage “ in all his wines. Julien’s arrival has cemented the family’s dedication to organic viticulture and minimal intervention winemaking.

After working a stint with Leon Barral in the Languedoc, 21 year old Jonathan-Didier Pabiot returned to his family domaine in Pouilly-Fumé with a passion for organic viticulture and strong ideas for the future. Jonathan’s father Didier — a 4th generation vigneron in Les Loges — was not easily persuaded of this new, natural path forward, but he nevertheless gave Jonathan-Didier 1.5 hectares of vines that were planted by his grandfather.

Brother Didier and Pascal Picq runs this 13 hectare vineyard. Their wines remain true to classic, traditional Chablis with all fermentation and ageing carried out in stainless steel tanks. MAISON CHAMPY

With three centuries of history and experience behind it, Maison Champy has established a precious know-how in the selection of rare and sought-after Burgundy crus. This is especially the case for Côte de Nuits, where long-term partnerships have enabled Maison Champy to follow the work in the vineyards throughout the year, all the way up to the harvest, before taking over both the winemaking and ageing process. It is a work of "haute couture", with long ageing periods (up to 16 months) and an average of only two barrels per wine.

Meanwhile he built his own domaine, parcel by parcel, with the vision of crafting Chablis that he loved to drink—for the table as an everyday pleasure.

MOREAU-NAUDET

Moreau-Naudet came from a family of vigneron, as far back as the 17th century, but domaine name itself only came into existence in 1950, following the marriage of Marie Naudet and René Moreau – Stéphane taking on the domaine from his father, Roger, in 1993. 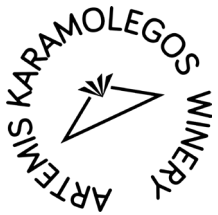

The Rousseau family's approach is to express grape, cluster, vine, parcel, and vineyard in the best possible way. This is practiced by keeping all work in the vineyards and cellar as close to the original as possible. Vineyards are plowed, and spraying is minimal. Rousseau is not organically certified but pays attention to what is done to maintain an active life in the vineyards with both insects and small animals. The vines are planted in the traditional way with about 11,000 plants per hectare. Farming is only part of what they do well. Esmonin also employs winemaking techniques that are gentle to the grapes and produce the finest possible quality level. Using a new bladder-press, Esmonin has excellent control over the amount of pressure exerted on the grapes, which are picked only when they have reached ideal ripeness. After a short cold maceration gives the wines an extra dimension of fruit, they are aged in carefully selected French oak barrels of Allier and Nevers forest wood made by Radoux and Berthomieu, two of the very best coopers. Wines are aged in barrels of varying age and toast and then blended in order to achieve optimum balance and complexity. The domaine ages its wines in wooden casks for between 14 to 17 months. Critics, too, recognize that Domaine Frédéric Esmonin is below the radar for the highest echelon of Burgundy collectors, hence the pricing is still affordable.

The famed Roman poet Ausonius poetically called the region Marojallia, which is where the winery known as Marojallia, found its name. Skipping ahead close to 1700 years, Margaux had already earned its well-deserved reputation for producing great wine. That reputation caused Thomas Jefferson, the third President of the United States to visit different Châteaux in the region, including Château Margaux.

CHÂTEAU MOUTON ROTHSCHILD

Mouton comes from the word motte, which literally means clod. This term was used for 'hill' in old French, and it eventually morphed into 'mouton'. Joseph de Brane, who was one of the first owners, chose to name his property after himself and the hill on which it was located. This resulted in the name Château Brane Mouton. Some 100 years later, the domain came up for sale and Isaac Thuret became the owner. In 1853, two years before the classification, he sold Brane Mouton to Nathaniel de Rothschild, who subsequently gave it its current name Château Mouton Rothschild.

According to legend, passing ships would lower their sails as a sign of respect when sailing past the château, which was owned by the Duke of Épernon, a powerful admiral at the time. Each button of his jacket was a pebble from his vineyard. The Marquis de Ségur, who was also president of the Bordeaux Parliament, placed Calon foremost among his preoccupations. The origin of the name Cos, meaning 'hill of pebbles' in old Gascon, perfectly reflects the location. Cos has slopes that are as well-drained as neighbouring Lafite's across the valley, with a plateau at 23m. "The vines – on peyrosol gravels over clay subsoils – lie in almost a single stretch around the estate." Today, the 100ha of Cos d'Estournel are made up of a mosaic of plots bordering the Gironde estuary. With an average age of 45 years for the vines, some are as old as 80 to over 100 years. The Grand Vin de Cos d'Estournel is made with grapes from vines that are 55 years old on average.

Natural cover crops (grass cover) are left in the rows between the vines and are mowed 2 or 3 times a year. In autumn the soil of every other row between the vines is tilled. Each of their four cru Barbarescos are given the same treatment to allow the uniqueness of each cru to express itself. Fermentation is done in oak, of which about 30% is new, followed by 18-20 months in neutral barriques.

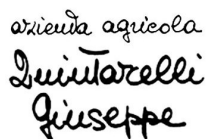

Primofiore Quintarelli wine is a wine that combines the tradition of the reds of Valpolicella with that of Bordeaux. At the end of the harvest, the grapes are left to dry for about a month before proceeding to fermentation. Before bottling, the wine ages for a year in large Slavonian oak barrels.
